

CAUCUS/COUNCIL MEETING

April 21, 2021

A REGULAR SCHEDULED CAUCUS/COUNCIL MEETING of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Carlstadt was held in the Council Chambers of the Borough Hall, 500 Madison Street, Carlstadt, New Jersey on Wednesday, April 21, 2021 at 7:00 P.M.

Mayor Robert Zimmermann asked Claire Foy, Borough Clerk to call the roll: Mayor Robert Zimmermann, Council members David Stoltz, James Lenoy, Joseph Emerson, Suzanne Fonseca and Diane DeBiase were present. Councilman William Roseman arrived at 7:55 P.M.

Joseph Crifasi, DPW Operations Manager, Joseph Donahue, Borough Attorney and Robert Ceberio of RCM Ceberio LLC were also present.

Mayor Zimmermann led all present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Mayor Zimmermann – This meeting has been called pursuant to the Open Public Meetings Law and in accordance with Section 5 of the Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this meeting having been provided in the annual notice schedule which contained the time, date and location of the meeting, copies of which were sent and advertised in the following official newspapers of Carlstadt: The Record on January 7, 2021 and the Herald News on January 7, 2021 a copy of which is on the Bulletin Board in the Borough Hall and a copy on file in the office of the Borough Clerk.

Mayor Zimmermann entertained a motion to suspend the regular order of business to present Izabella Frezzo, a student of Becton Regional High School, with a Proclamation for her achievements. On motion by Fonseca, seconded by DeBiase, unanimous on call of roll of those present.

Donald Molzon, 530 Madison Street – he addressed the matter of beehives and maintenance conditions of his neighbor at 540 Madison Street. He provided pictures for the Mayor and Council. The matter was discussed extensively with the Mayor and Council, Joseph Crifasi, DPW Operations Manager, Joseph Donahue, Borough Attorney and residents such as Adam Lech, 509 Madison Street, who were present. Damage to other neighboring properties was also discussed. This is an ongoing situation and the State of New Jersey has inspected the property and advised that the homeowner must reduce the beehives on his property to only three per State regulations. The Borough has other options to enforce compliance including criminal nuisance

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complaints as well as disturbing the peace violations and zoning violations regarding overall maintenance of property. Mathew Gasiuk, the owner of 540 Madison Street, was present and he advised the Mayor and Council that he sold some of the hives and has reduced the number on his property. He is also not aware of any damage caused by the bees on neighboring properties. Mayor Zimmermann advised him three is the maximum number of beehives, per New Jersey State regulations, that he is allowed to maintain.

Mayor Zimmermann entertained a motion to close the hearing of citizens.
